Dr. Chuang moved to California 10 years ago (2006) after served as Norins (Endowed) Professor of Dermatology at Indiana University (Indianapolis) for 9 years (1995-2004) and Medical Director of Melanoma Program(1995-2004). Currently he practiced at Healthcare Partners at Mission Hills and as Clinical Professor of Dermatology at University of Southern California. His specialty is skin cancer and clinical epidemiology and had more than 150 publications including peer reviewed papers, book chapters, and abstracts. Dr. Chuang graduated from National Taiwan University College of Medicine (合大醫學院), trained as Chief Resident of Dermatology at NTUH (合大總醫師), Dermatology Chief Resident (University of Chicago) and Epidemiology/Dermatology Fellow (Mayo Clinic). Academia Career began at University of Wisconsin (Madison) as Assistant/Associate Professor and later Associate Professor at Wright State University (Dayton) before joining Indiana University as Professor.
