### **KEE C. LING, B.Sc., J.D. Administrative Law Judge**

Born in Malaysia, immigrated to Canada in 1969 in his late teens, Kee C. Ling then came to the United States to pursue a legal education and graduated with a Doctorate of Jurisprudence degree in 1978.

He practiced privately for many years before he went to work for the U.S. Department of Justice as a Trial Attorney in 1988, specializing in immigration law. He distinguished himself in his case presentation in court, which led to two of his cases establishing precedents to remain in the books forever.

In June 1992, he was appointed by the California Unemployment Insurance Appeals Board as an Administrative Law Judge, and he has remained in that capacity until the present.

Judge Ling is the first and only Chinese-American Judge in Ventura County and an active participant in community affairs. He is an active member and a past president of the Ventura County Chinese American Association. He teaches kung fu and lion dance as a hobby in the Ventura County community.
